

- 1. Name, Credentials, Contact Info for each presenter
- 2. Presentation Format: Workshop or Panel
- 3. Presentation Theme: (Mental Health, Medical SW, School SW, Program Development, Activism, Ethics, Higher Education, Private Practice)
- 4. Title of presentation: 15 words or less
- Abstract (brief summary of your proposal, which will be used in the conference materials): 100 words or less
- 6. Proposal describing your workshop in detail: 1,000 words or less
- Proposals are due on October 18, 2021 by 11:59PM CST. Proposal decisions will be communicated via email to the primary presenter no later than December 1, 2021.
