Master of Arts in Teaching Department of Instruction & Curriculum Leadership Advising Sheet

Welcome to the Physical Education Teacher Education Program, which leads to a Master of Arts in Teaching (MAT) Degree and a Tennessee License to teach grades K-12. This degree sheet is a guide for selecting and sequencing courses required in the MAT program. - **Teacher Education Program (TEP):** MAT candidates must apply for admission to TEP before the end of the second semester and fulfill all TEP requirements. Candidates must have a 3.0 graduate GPA to be admitted to TEP and maintain a 3.0 GPA while in the graduate program.
- **Licensure Exams:** Candidates are required to pass Praxis II exams in order to be licensed to teach in Tennessee. For registration information, costs and more details go to www.ets.org, click on Praxis and use the dropdown menu to find the correct required exams.

- **edTPA:** All candidates obtaining a MAT and TN Teaching Licensure must complete The Professional Seminar (ICL 7993). Each candidate must complete and pass a nationally scored teacher performance assessment, edTPA. You are only required to submit the edTPA portfolio if you are enrolled in ICL 7808. Job-embedded teacher candidates are not required to submit the edTPA.

Fall I Semester (9 Hours)

- EDPR 7117 - Life Span Development
- PETE 7006 - Instruction in PETE**
- PEE 7202 - Curriculum and Instruction Models in PETE**

Spring I Semester (9 Hours)

- IDT 7061 - Media and Technology
- PETE 7207 - Adaptive Technologies in PETE**
- PETE 7203 - Assessment and Evaluation in PETE**

Summer I Semester (0-9 Hours)

- If you plan to graduate in 1.5 years, 3 classes would need to be taken. Level I classes, PETE 7152, or PETE/ ICL electives.

Requirements Timeline

Fall I Semester

Spring I Semester

- Continue Praxis support and studying.
- Continue to take your Praxis II Content exam(s) if not already passed.
- Apply for TEP Admissions.
- **If you are not admitted to TEP, you will not be able to continue to Level 2 course work.**

Summer I Semester

- Continue to take Praxis II Content exam(s) if not already passed.
- Apply for TEP Admissions .

Level 2 Course Work

Fall II Semester (9 Hours)

- SPED 7000 - Introduction to Exceptional Learners**
- ICL 7030 - Assessment & Evaluation**
- EDPR 752I - Introduction to Educational Research
- OR
- HMSE 7010 - Research in Health Studies

- Complete Clinical Teaching application.

- If PETE 7203 and PETE 7207 are taken in place of SPED 7000 and ICL 7030, students will take 2 PETE/ICL electives to replace those classes in Level Two.

Level 3 Course Work

Spring II Semester (9 Hours)

- ICL 7808 - The Clinical Teaching Semester
- ICL 7993 - Professional Seminar (REQUIRED OF ALL CANDIDATES)

- Candidates should have all courses completed and have passed:
- Praxis 5095 (PE: Content and Design K-12) completed prior to enrolling in Level 3 Courses.

- An application is required one (1) semester prior to The Clinical Teaching Semester – ICL 7808.
- All clinical teaching candidates must take the Professional Seminar to obtain licensure- ICL 7993.
- (No other courses may be taken with the clinical teaching semester and/or the ICL 7993 Professional Seminar or 7992 Master's Project classes).
- Candidates who have an active Job Embedded Practitioner License will be exempt from submitting the edTPA.
