- Key inner-city neighborhood in a strategic location surrounded by strong neighborhood initiatives & institutional anchors
- Under utilized & under invested pocket in a strategic location surrounded by investment
- Highest bus transfers in the region
- Transitional area with potential to increase walkability
- Unhealed scar from failed I-40 route through Midtown
- Cleared blighted blocks in Washington Bottoms
