Program Admissions*

Applicants will apply to the specific certificate program (i.e., Interdisciplinary Graduate Certificate in Disabilities Studies). They should submit:

- Transcript of undergraduate degree program and transcripts of prior and current graduate study;
- 2. Three letters of recommendation; and
- A letter describing reasons for wishing to take a graduate certificate in the area of disability studies and how the program corresponds with prior experience and anticipated career plans.
