

## Drama

In the Drama event, each group will present one scene from the respective dramatic literature in the target language, or an original skit written solely by the students. Schools will have to provide their own costumes, props, and equipment. Students will be evaluated on the correct use of the target language and pronunciation (50%), and acting and theatricality, including acting ability, costumes, props, presentation, and observance of the time limit (50%).

***PLEASE NOTE:***

- Judges must be given a copy of the text/script used.
- Scenes must be acted **from memory** and ***must not exceed 10 minutes***, including set-up time.

One of the group members will bring a judging form, the top part of which they have filled out, and will give this to the judge before performing. The judge will use the form to judge the students as they perform.

**Judging Criteria:** Use of language and pronunciation (50%) and acting and theatricality. (50%)

***WHO MAY COMPETE:*** Foreign language students, native and heritage speakers, and speakers of cognate languages are welcome to participate in this event.

**LIMITS:** No limits on number of entries.
