Art

Students will submit an original work of art, which might take various forms: paintings, drawings, collages (e.g. photo), etc. Each work of art should be a student's personal, individual expression related to foreign language or culture. Works should be visually-based, but do not need to include text.

Attractiveness, originality, cultural appropriateness, and obvious effort are the criteria for judging. If teachers have any doubts about the appropriateness of a work of art, please contact the Fair Director.

Each work of art must have a 3x5 card attached with the following information: "Category: Art", name of student, school, language, title of work, name of teacher. Maximum of two entries per class and one student per work of art. Works of art must not exceed an area 2 feet by 3 feet, since space will be limited.

PLEASE NOTE:

- Due to health concerns and University regulations, food items may not be submitted as art.
- Works of art that have won prizes in previous years (even if it was in a different category) may not be re-submitted.
- Since Art is open to both native and non-native speakers, if the target language is included in the art piece, it will NOT be counted towards or against the submission.

Judging Criteria: Intellectual Content (40%), Creativity/Originality (40%), and Cultural Relevance (20%)

WHO MAY COMPETE: Foreign language students, native and heritage speakers, and speakers of cognate languages are welcome to participate in this event.

LIMITS: Maximum of two entries per class and one student per work of art.
