




Edoardo Falcone, born in 1968 in Rome, studied at the Fersen International School of Acting. He began writing and acting in the theatre, and in 2010 made the move to film, writing the scripts for the hits Nessuno mi può giudicare, Viva l'Italia and Ti ricordi di me?

Laura Morante, born in 1956 in Santa Fiora, Tuscany, is the niece of renowned Italian novelist Elsa Morante. Her 1980 film debut was in Bertolucci's *Oggetti smarriti*. She won the David di Donatello best actress award for *La stanza del figlio* and the Nastro d'Argento for *L'amore* è eterno finché dura.





Alessandro Gassman, son of Vittorio Gassman, was born in 1965 in Rome. At 17, he debuted in *Di padre in figlio, an* autobiographical film written and directed by his father. He has won several awards, including the David di Donatello and Nastro d'Argento for best supporting actor in *Caos Calmo*.

Marco Giallini, born in Rome in 1963, attended the Scuola d'Arte of Roma. After years of experience with important theatre directors, such as Arnoldo Foà, he made his cinematic debut in 1995 and won the Nastro d'argento award for Best Supporting Actor in 2012.
