CHIN 3402: Readings in Chinese Culture

Presentations: The students are required to present on their assigned topics approximately every two weeks. For presentation topics, please see schedule. The presentations can be done in English. However, if it is in English, I would expect more content. Each presentation should be a minimum of 7 minutes.

Summaries of the presentations: Students need to turn in a written outline of their presentation which includes all the key points (with complete sentences) after the presentation. It can be done in either English or Chinese.

Written exams: The exams will include major cultural and language knowledge.

Extra credits: Extra credits will be awarded to the students who choose to present on the other group's topics in addition to their own. Two points will be added to the final presentation grade for each extra presentation and outline. Please notify the instructor prior to the day of the presentation.
