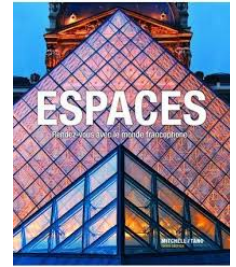

Course Description:

FREN 2010 continues the students' exploration of the French language and cultures of French-speaking peoples at an intermediate level. It uses the students' knowledge of elementary-level skills to add ease and confidence in their reading, writing, speaking and listening skills, as well as depth to their understanding and knowledge of French and Francophone literatures and cultures. The course covers the materials of Unités 9-12 in *Espaces*.

Tests:

There will be three (3) tests, each covering one chapter (Unité): 9, 10, and 11. You will be tested on listening comprehension, vocabulary, grammar, and culture.

Final Exam:

The written Final Exam will be comprehensive, covering Unités 9-12. The final will include sections and items similar to the tests. There will not be an individual test for Unité 12 but will be included in the Final.

Oral Presentations:

The oral presentation will be an opportunity to show off to the class your ability to speak French through a conversation or presentation 3-5 minutes in length during and at the end of the semester. The topic will be related to the culture and material discussed in class this semester.

Participation:

Learning a foreign language is like learning to play a sport or a musical instrument: it requires regular practice. Since French class is the primary practice space, you are expected to attend class each day, to participate actively during each lesson, and to bring your copies of the required course materials to class every day. You are expected to have read and done the assignments listed on the class schedule **before** arriving in class. If you are not prepared, do not actively participate, are disruptive, arrive late, or leave early without a valid excuse, you will lose participation points.

Quizzes:

There will be announced quizzes throughout the semester at the beginning of class periods. This is a way to help you (and me) gauge how well you are keeping up with the material.

Homework:

All homework will be completed and turned in at the beginning of the class period for which they are due. The homework will be posted on eCourseware.

POLICIES**Class Attendance Policy:**

Due to the fact that a language course is a skills course, the Department of Foreign Languages has a **mandatory** attendance policy. No more than 6 absences in courses that meet three times a week (TR) can be allowed without penalty. For **EACH** absence beyond this, **2 points (TR) will be deducted** from the student's **FINAL COURSE AVERAGE**.

Make-up Policy:

Tests- If you miss a Test for a valid reason (e.g. serious illness, university-approved excuse), you must contact the instructor within 1 week and provide documentation on request. If not, you will not be able to make it up.

Assignments- If you don't turn in homework on its due date and don't have a valid excuse, you have up to one week to turn in the assignment. You'll be penalized 10% for each weekday it is late (for example, if an assignment is due Friday, it will be a 10% deduction if you turn it in on Monday.) Work more than one week late will not be accepted.

All quizzes are given during the first ten minutes of class. Quizzes cannot be made up unless the absence or lateness is sanctioned by the University. The last 2 quizzes will replace the worse quiz grade or absence/lateness.

Cheating:

Cheating of any kind will not be tolerated. For graded assignments, it is cheating to copy someone else's work; to have another person (tutor, friend, student, etc.) help you edit, correct, or write your work; to let another student copy your work; to use unauthorized materials (online translator, cheat sheet, etc.), or to copy from a source without proper citation. Not knowing if something counts as cheating is NOT a valid excuse. If you have questions about what is or isn't allowed, please contact me before doing it. In addition, the use of phones or computer is strictly prohibited during testing. If you are caught using any electronic device during testing, it will be considered cheating.

Copies and E-Documents:

Due to budgetary concerns affecting our Department and the University, it is no longer possible for instructors to make paper copies of most documents. You are expected to check your email and e-courseware regularly for electronic files related to this course.

-In-class activities: It is your responsibility to come to class prepared every day by having any documents that you need for in-class activities already loaded on your device, or printing them out before you come to class. Thank you very much for your understanding and cooperation.

-Homework: For any assignments that need to be turned in, your instructor will indicate to you whether these should be handed in on paper or electronically.
