- Dictation (10%): Dictation will be given at the beginning of every class unless noted otherwise. At the end of the semester, two lowest scores will be dropped.
- Test 1,2,3 (Each test is 10%): The test is given after finishing each chapter.
- **Oral Test (15%)**: Students will create and perform a skit with his/her partner using words and phrase we will learn through the semester. Check the calendar for the date. Additional guidelines will be provided in advance.
- Final exam (25%): The final exam in this course is cumulative, incorporating all chapters, grammar, and vocabulary from the entire semester. The final exam will contain a written as well as listening section.
