Advanced Grammar Speech Syllabus SPAN 4308-001

Course Information

Course Description

SPAN 4308 is an advanced Spanish grammar course that focuses on special problems in Spanish grammar pertaining to the use of prepositions, the placement of adjectives, the future tense, the conditional mood, the reflexive forms, the passive voice, the past participles in absolute constructions, writing styles, vocabulary, and idiomatic expressions. This course is based on the understanding that second language acquisition takes place through active use of the language.

Course Objectives

The overall goal of this course is to gain a fuller grasp of Spanish Grammar and to further develop an advanced level of Spanish oral and written production while deepening the awareness and appreciation for Hispanic/Latino culture. At the end of the course, students will be able to:

- Analyze various forms of literature genres
- Attain an advanced proficiency level when writing/speaking in Spanish
- Further develop proper Spanish grammar and style in writing
- Build new vocabulary through contextualized readings
- Use familiar and newly acquired vocabulary in written/spoken communication
- Acquire cultural knowledge through cinema and class discussion

Prerequisites

This course is recommended for the Spanish major and minor and a minimum of three 3000-level Spanish courses or equivalent is a prerequisite.

Course Topics

There are seven (7) modules or chapters within this course. Multiple modules will be open from the beginning of the semester in case some students want to progress faster; however, all students need to complete the modules in order and do all assigned activities and assessments of one module before moving to the next one.

Testing Procedures

The midterm and final exams as well as the quizzes will be completed online. No proctor will be needed for any of the quizzes or tests. However, remember that both tests will be timed, so you will only have 60 minutes to complete each test (midterm and final). Once you open each test, you must complete it since you can only open it once.

All oral assignments will be conducted via Zoom. The instructor will grade and provide feedback for each assessment up to a week after the due date of the assessment's

submission. Students should check, print, and complete the items inside the Weekly Schedule daily. Missing the due dates will significantly lower the grade of students.

ORIENTATION ASSIGNMENTS (4%)

There are two (2) short assignments within this category: "¡Preséntate!" (1%) and "Prueba de orientación" (2%).

- The objective of "¡Preséntate!" is making sure that students get to know each
 other since the beginning of class. Instruction for this assignment can be found
 within the Getting started module. To submit this assignment, students will need
 to go to Communication/Discussion.
- The objective of the "Prueba de orientación" is to ensure that students have read
 the material inside the Orientation module. Understanding the class policies and
 procedures is essential to succeed in a hybrid course. That is why students
 need to understand the Orientation section before they start working on the
 assignments. The Orientation Quiz can be found inside
 eCourseware/Assessment/Quizzes.

12 CHAT SESSIONS (18%)

Attendance to Zoom meetings is a crucial component to be successful in this class. There will be two Zoom meetings per module (or one per week): On the first meeting we will discuss the reading and in the second one, we will complete grammar exercises from the textbook and clarify any doubts concerning the course.

- Participation Students are expected to actively contribute to class and group discussions both by asking and by answering questions. Participation also includes using the target language of the course, i.e., Spanish. Failure to actively participate in the class will result in the deduction of the student's grade.
- Attendance: Students will be required to attend a Zoom meeting once per week to participate in class discussions. Being absent from Zoom meetings, connecting late, leaving the meeting early, and regularly entering and leaving the meeting while class is in session will affect the student's grade.

NOTE: Students will meet in a small group setting rather than as a whole class. The meetings will be held via the Zoom platform during the official class times. The instructor will assign the small groups in the first week of classes and each group will meet on different days. It's important for students to know what days they are meeting and to follow their assigned meeting schedule throughout the semester. All Zoom meeting dates can be found in the Weekly Schedule inside the Orientation Module.

Attendance and Tardiness Policy

- Weekly attendance is compulsory and expected.
- Every 3 times a student comes late to the meeting counts as 1 absence.
- Excused Absences require official documentation. Examples of a valid excuse include an official doctor's note, an official court citation, a published funeral notice, or an official police report. These documents must state clearly the date (and time if possible).
- Non-acceptable documentation includes attendance to a wedding or other social event, travel arrangements, employer-related requirements, a drug prescription, a routine doctor's appointment. I

7 LECTURAS (7%)

There will be a total of seven (7) Reading Quizzes (one per chapter) that students must complete. The objective of these quizzes is to make sure that students have a better understanding of the reading before having the Chat Session in which they will discuss the comprehension and interpretation questions orally.

6 INTERPRETACIONES (6%)

There will be a total of six (6) Interpretation Dropbox Assignments (chapters 8-13) that students have to complete. These assignments contain the interpretation questions that students will use when discussing the reading during the Chat Sessions.

7 SECCIONES GRAMATICALES (7%)

There will be a total of seven (7) Grammar Quizzes (one per chapter) that students must complete. The objective of these quizzes is to make sure that students practice and understand the grammar concepts covered in the chapter.

6 SECCIONES LÉXICAS (6%)

There will be a total of six (6) Vocabulary Assignments (chapters 8-13) that students have to complete. These assignments contain vocabulary exercises that will help students explore the etymology and usage of certain Spanish lexicon.

6 DISTINCIONES (6%)

There will be a total of six (6) Distinctiones Quizzes (chapters 8-13) that students must complete. The objective of these quizzes is to explore Spanish verbs and expressions that can be confusing for students by clarifying their usage, rules, and exceptions.

6 PARA ESCRIBIR MEJOR (6%)

There will be a total of six (6) Writing Quizzes (chapters 8-13) that students have to complete. These quizzes focus on various aspects that are useful when writing in Spanish. They will help students become better writers by improving their writing style.

6 COMPOSICIONES (12%)

There will be a total of six (6) compositions (chapters 8-13) that students have to write. These speaking activities will help students deepen their knowledge of the unit's theme by researching a particular topic.

PELÍCULAS (6%)

Students will watch two (2) movies this semester and complete a reaction in a journal entry for each one of them inside the discussion board.

ENSAYO FINAL (5%):

Students will be given a topic and they will record a five-minute video about it at the end of the semester. Rubrics will be provided in the future.

ENTREVISTA ORAL (5%)

At the end of the semester, students will have an individual oral interview with the instructor via Zoom in which they will talk about the topics discussed throughout the course. Students must speak exclusively in Spanish and be ready to answer questions about their experience in the course as well as their plans for their future. No make-ups or extensions are allowed.

EXÁMENES (16%)

There will be two (2) tests in this course. The Midterm will cover the first three chapters (1-3) and the Final Exam will cover the last three chapters (4-6). Each test may include vocabulary activities, grammar exercises, comprehension questions, listening activities, and one reading comprehension exercise. Students will have **ONE ATTEMPT** to complete each test. Students also should bear in mind that once they open the test, they need to finish it. Therefore, students should make sure to set 60 minutes aside to complete each test. No make-ups or extensions are allowed.

EXTRA CREDIT: ENCUESTA DE FIN DE SEMESTRE (+1%)

There will be only one opportunity to receive extra credit in this course. In order to receive this extra point on the final grade, students must complete the End-of-the Semester Survey, inside Assessment/Surveys.
