Study abroad opportunities are available during summer sessions, fall and spring semesters, and for a full academic year. Excellent scholarship opportunities are available for qualified students.

Valladolid, Spain | Summer | 6 credits in Spanish (Beginner to Advanced) while living in dorms or homestays. Includes tuition and housing. Cultural activities and weekend travel optional.

Costa Rica | Summer | 6 credits in Spanish at UNA–Sarapiquí. Live on campus, study with small classes, and explore Costa Rican culture.

Alicante, Spain | Semester or Summer | Study Spanish language and culture on the Mediterranean coast. Courses available for all levels. Live with host families or in student apartments.

Santiago, Chile | Semester or Summer | Immerse yourself in Chilean culture while taking Spanish language and Latin American studies. Ideal for students of all levels.

Montevideo, Uruguay | Semester or Summer | Study Spanish in a safe, walkable capital by the beach. Courses in language, culture, and Latin American studies.

DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

General Education (41 hrs)

Complete university-wide Gen Ed requirements.

College & BA Requirements (6–9 hrs)

Additional coursework as required by the College of Arts & Sciences. If you have prior academic or lived experience with Spanish, contact the advising team for testing options.

Major Requirements (24–33 hrs)

Choose one of the following concentrations:

- Single Language (Spanish only): 24 upper-division hrs, including SPAN 4410 & 4510
- Two Languages: 27 upper-division hrs (min. 9 hrs per language)
- Three Languages: 33 upper-division hrs (min. 12 hrs in two languages + coursework in a third)
- Electives as needed to reach 120 total credit hours.

Minor in Spanish (18 hrs)

SPAN 1020, 2010, 2020 + 3 upper-division courses

Accelerated BA/MA

Earn up to 12 graduate credit hours during your BA that apply to both degrees.

Graduate Studies

Master of Arts in Romance Languages with a Concentration in Spanish: 2-year program focused on training language teachers, serving students planning to pursue a Ph.D. in the language of concentration, or use the target language in a professional setting.
